Title 1 Program

- This is a federally funded program based on the numbers of economically disadvantaged students at the school.
- Economically disadvantaged is determined by the free/reduced lunch population at the school.
- Quest is a “targeted assistance” school which means we receive money that must be spent ONLY on students targeted for help in reading and/or math (Students who are served in these content areas do not need to qualify for free/reduced lunch).
- Quest Title 1 funds support our reading and math intervention programs.

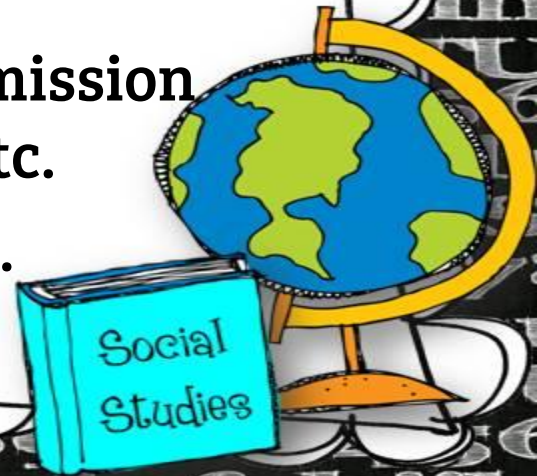


Take Home Communication Folder (Green Folder)

Class Blog

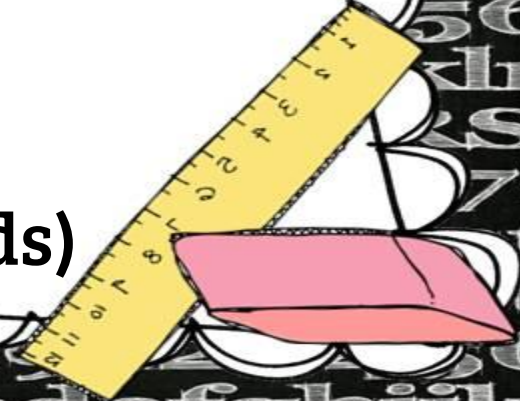

Students will receive grades for the mastery of standards in all subject areas.

Assessing for mastery will help us know:

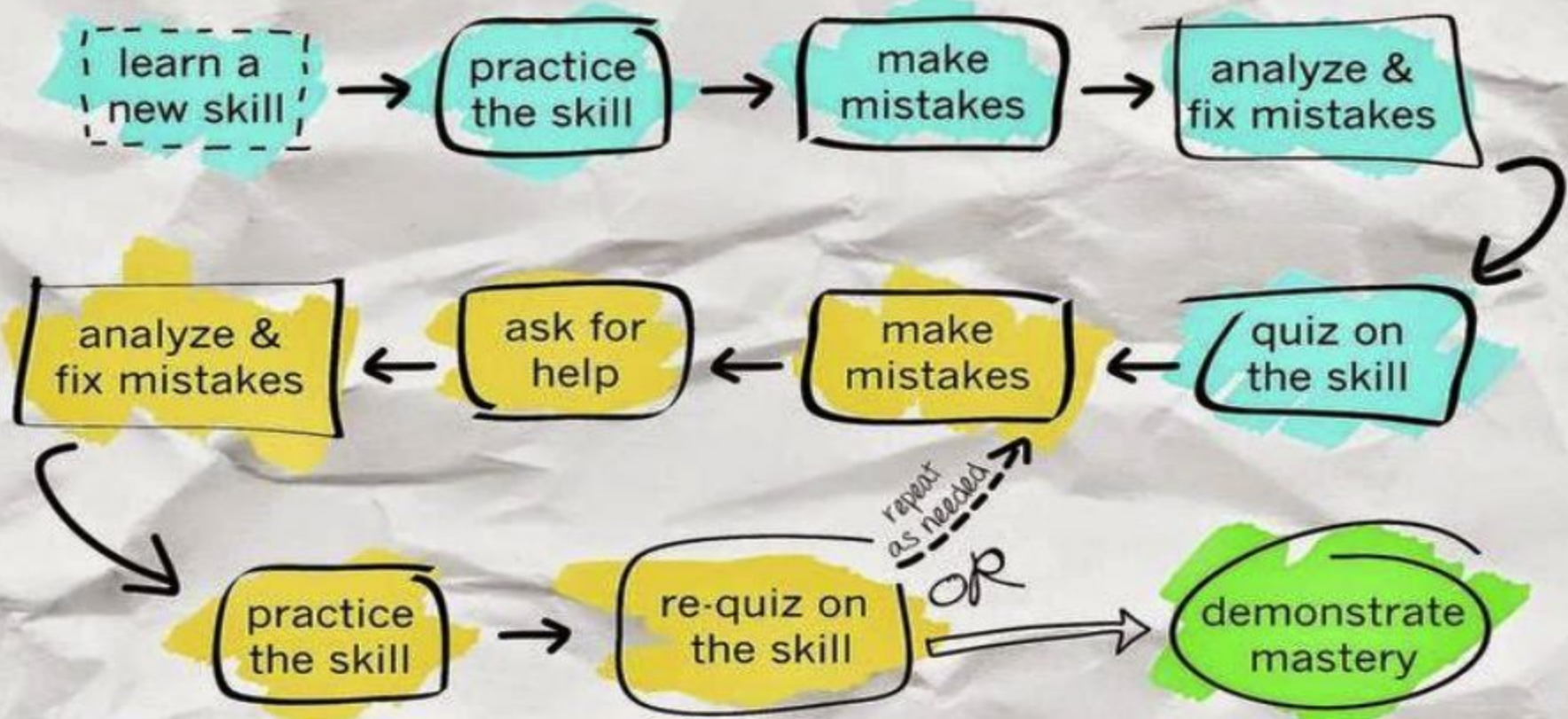
if students need additional help,

What is standards based grading?



Grading Scale

- 4 100%-90% The student demonstrates mastery of the standard (can apply and teach).
- 3 89%-80% The student demonstrates proficiency of the standard.
- 2 79%-60% The student is approaching proficiency.
- 1 59%-0% The student is well below proficiency.
