- ✓ Students will come to class prepared. This means ready to learn with all assignments completed.

Classroom Policies:

Absences

Student work will be left on top of their desk while they are absent. It will be the student's responsibility to meet with me to go over material and questions on the work. Class work missed is to be completed as homework and turned in by the date specified; otherwise the assignment(s) will be considered late and graded accordingly. The number of days your student has to make up absent work is equal to the number of days he or she has missed. If you plan to pick up your student's work at the end of the day, please notify the office by 9 a.m. to give me time to get the assignments put together before the end of the day.

Planners

In order to help students get their homework assignments done, students will be given a Planner to be filled out every day. All assignments are written on the Planner Board. If a student does not have his/her planner, then a blank piece of paper is to be used to write down the information. Please be sure to initial your student's planner each night so that I know that the student completed all assigned tasks.

Class work/Homework Assignments

Students are expected to be responsible for completing and turning in all class work, homework assignments, and any projects on time. Students are expected to be prepared with all their materials. Students will not be allowed to call home if they forget their work. Students should pack their backpacks at night with all the materials needed for the next day. Organization is the key to success! (Note: Any class work not completed will be homework.) Homework will vary with lessons.

Late Work

Points will be deducted for any late work, whether class work or homework. Missing work reports will be given out each Monday. All missing work will be due on or before Friday. Any work not completed by Friday will receive a score of O!

Birthdays

Administration has asked that students not bring in any food-type treats. Please do not feel "obligated" to have your student bring in anything for their birthday. Your child's birthday will still be acknowledged. To avoid any hurt feelings, please

mail birthday invitations to classmates' homes. Do not have your child distribute his/her invitations before or after school, as this may also cause hurt feelings. Each child's birthday will be celebrated in class by the teacher! Students with summer birthdays will be celebrated on an UN-birthday!

Classroom Discipline

Students will be required to maintain a respectful presence in the classroom at all times. As a teacher I believe in creating a positive classroom environment that focuses on each student's strengths and encourages respectful behavior. Students will be able to earn behavior bucks for positive choices! Students may receive "fines" determined by the teacher for disrespectful behavior or inappropriate choices. At the end of each month students will be able to spend their behavior bucks at the class store. Behavior bucks will not be replaced if lost or stolen.

<u>Tests</u>

Tests are used a gauge of my teaching as well as student learning. Tests will be announced in advance in class. Tests will be given as needed, but usually at the end of each unit in math, science, reading, and spelling. Tests will be graded and returned to students within three days.

School Calendar

Uniform Policy

SIS Grading Program

Grades will be posted on a weekly basis. Be sure to check your student's progress. You can obtain a user name and password during back to school night. I update SIS on the weekend so Monday will be the best day to check your student's grades.

If your student has a Zero it means the assignment in missing. The grading program we use does not allow "E" for excused or "M" for missing.

Curriculum:

Language Arts

We will cover spelling, writing, vocabulary, grammar, etc. Students are expected to write in their best handwriting. All work must be neat and able to read. Students may be asked to redo an assignment that is not legible. We will focus on non-fiction

texts this year. All curriculum standards are from the Common Core and can be viewed at http://www.uen.org/core/.

Reading

Students will be expected to read, at home, a minimum of 20 minutes a night. Reading to a parent/guardian or even a younger sibling can be counted as part of the 20 minutes.

Utah History

In Utah History we will study the geography, people (past and current), and government of Utah. We will spend time debating the policies, history, and decisions made throughout the state as well as focusing on current event that pertain to Utah. In addition to the Utah History curriculum, we will be doing 2-3 projects. A letter with all the requirements and due date for each project will be sent home. We will also be completing our "AMAZING UTAH" map as a class. Please see the attached letter explaining this activity and SEND IN YOUR PICTURES!!!

Science

We will be covering five areas: Weather, Water Cycle, Rocks & Minerals, Fossils, Utah Wetlands, and Plants & Animals. We will be doing some hands-on activities, Power-Point/Keynote presentations and models. There may be some activities that will need to be done as homework.

Math

We will be doing timed multiplication tests. Students need to know their multiplication facts. It would be great if you could help your student with knowing their facts through 12's. This is in addition to the regular Math curriculum. Math will focus on task based projects, and real world application of learning.

<u>Technology</u>

Students will have access to both the PC Lab and Mac Lab. We will have computer class twice a week. We will also be utilizing laptops, in the classroom, as we have rolling computer labs (COWs). Be sure to fill out the Internet Usage form; otherwise, your child will not be able to have access to our computers.

Physical Education

P.E. is held either in the gym or outside. We do exercises, run laps, practice P.E. skills, and play games. Therefore, your child needs to wear appropriate clothing

and footwear as per the uniform policy. If you feel your child should not participate in P.E. on a particular day, please write a note stating the reason. All children will be expected to participate unless they have a note excusing them.

Projects

Please! Please! Resist the temptation to "Do" your student's project. Help, give guidance, go over the directions with them, but Don't Do. Allow your student to do the work. This is another way of learning, by doing and feeling a sense of accomplishment.

As part of our fourth grade core curriculum, we will be studying Utah; it's history, geology, geography, people past and present, and government.
