

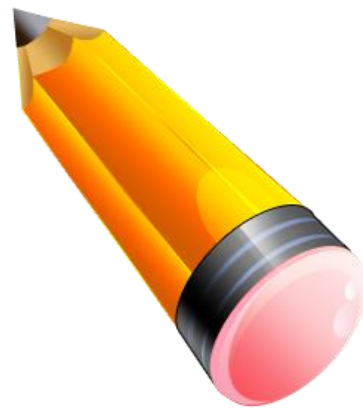

Behavior Expectations:

There are three school wide rules which all students must follow. These rules must be taught in the classroom, rehearsed, and reinforced throughout the year.

1. Respectful Movement-

a. Students are expected to use non-disruptive, respectful behavior in the hallway before school, after school, and during class transitions. Running, pushing, slamming lockers and other disruptive behavior may result in a deduction in citizenship points or a detention referral.

2. Self Start – Students will start on regular daily assignments or tasks without being prompted.

3. Follow Directions – Students must follow directions the first time given.

*Please be familiar with the dress code policy as I will be enforcing it.

Reward/ Discipline Procedures:

My class will follow the same rules that are required throughout the entire school. (See page 15 in the Parent handbook for specific rules and consequences.)

Grading Policy:

Large writing assignments and tests will be worth more points than other items. Assignments that will have continual points will be Independent Reading and Journal Writing Points. There will also be spelling/vocabulary/ and grammar points integrated throughout. For each literary unit I will hand out an overview that will outline the unit expectations, along with possible extra credit or extension options.

Absent Students:

Students are responsible to ask for their own missing work. Students have as many days as they missed to get the work completed and turned in to me. For example, if they

were absent two days, they have two days (after returning) to complete the missed assignments. *I will not call for them.* Getting and completing missed work is the STUDENT'S responsibility. If there are extenuating circumstances, please contact me to make arrangements for make-up work.

Grading of Student Work:

The student's scores and grades may be accessed at any time online through the Student Information System (SIS). SIS can be accessed through the link on the Quest webpage (www.questacademycharter.org) under the "Get Involved" tab. I will update grades in SIS on a regular basis~ at least once weekly on Friday.

If there are points possible but your student's score is blank either your student has been excused from the assignment or it means I have entered the task but not yet entered their score. If your student has a Zero (0), then the assignment is missing. If you have any questions about your student's grades, feel free to contact me.

Late Work:

Students will have one school week, five week days, after the due date to get an assignment turned in to the teacher or it will not be accepted. The student will be docked 10% of the assignment's point value **for every day that it is late** until day six, when it can no longer be turned in for credit.

Extra Credit:

I occasionally offer extra credit. When I do, I expect students who are struggling to take advantage of the opportunity!

Tardy Policy:

A student is considered tardy if they are not settled, not in the process of sitting, in their assigned seat when the tardy bell rings. Extensive tardiness will result in further action.

Brief Overview of Assignments:

- ⊕ Daily Journal – Students will be required to write daily. This will be checked for participation.
- ⊕ Reading –
 - Students will be required to read 20 minutes every day, outside of class. The following items can be considered reading: reading homework for any classes, fiction chapter and non-fiction books, online articles or research, graphic novels, comic books and magazines. (The last three are only considered reading if you read the words, not just look at the pictures.) Activities which are not considered reading outside the classroom would include any social networking sites such as Facebook or MySpace, email, Twitter, texts, gaming and casual surfing in which you do not read; rather, jump from site to site.
 - There will also be reading time provided every day during class. If students are not reading during the allotted time, points will be deducted.

- ⊕ Novels – the terms will be centered around four novels (one per term) will include reading, discussions, vocabulary, worksheets, quizzes and tests. Novels we will read this year: *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury, *I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings* by Maya Angelou, *The Grapes of Wrath* by John Steinbeck, and *Macbeth* by William Shakespeare.
- ⊕ Term Papers- Each term we there will be a larger writing assignment that we will be working on throughout the term. It will usually be related to the reading we are doing that term. These will be a larger percentage of the student’s grade. These writing assignments are important. If you have any question regarding them, please feel free to contact me.
- ⊕ Weekly Spelling and Grammar- Spelling words will be given every Monday and will be tested on that Friday.

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Communication:

Grades will be discussed in your PTC or anytime you would like to set up a meeting to discuss with me any concerns. You will find my email on the first page of this syllabus or on the school website. You can also contact me by phone.
