The Diary of Anne Frank

Eighth grade English unit

This unit portrays the tragic drama of Anne Frank's life. Set against the horrific background of the Holocaust, the story of Anne Frank is recreated within the same walls in which she and her family hid from Nazi Germany's "final solution", or the *annihilation* of all Jews.

- 1. Why are Miep and Mr. Kraler helping the Franks and Van Daans? Would you? If so, why?
- 2. Compare/contrast Anne and Peter
- 3. Describe the mood of the Hanukkah celebration.
- 4. Anne is a dynamic character in the play. Why is this a true statement?
- 5. What do you thing the main conflict in the play is and when does it reach its climax?
- 6. Compare/contrast the novel and the video segments.
- Activity- What Would You Take With You?
- Two comprehension guizzes
- Various activities, assignments, notes.

Post reading:

- Poem memorization test
- Argumentative Essay: "Could something like this happen today?"
 - -300 words
 - -choose a side

Extra credit: (20 pts each- May pick two. Turn in at any time during unit.)

- 1. Make a traditional Hanukkah recipe for your family. Bring in an explanation (1/2 page typed) of the experience, a note from your parent/guardian stating that you made the recipe and how it tasted, along with a copy of the recipe made.
- Create a series of journal entries from another character in the play. Must have <u>five</u> (or more) entries of at least 50 words each. Legible handwriting! Journal entry format: Date, greeting, specific event description.
- 3. Do you see anyone in the play as a hero? In a 200-word essay, discuss the qualities and actions that you think make this person a hero. Give specific examples from the play. **MUST BE TYPED.**
- 4. The Geography of Anne Frank: Using a map of Europe, find the major locations for the events in the drama of Anne Frank: Amsterdam, Auschwitz concentration camp, Frankfurt, Germany. Do this as a library research project. Find a map of Amsterdam and Locate Anne's home, the Secret Annex, Jewish Secondary, and the train stations she would have left from.
