A Game for 4-24 Players

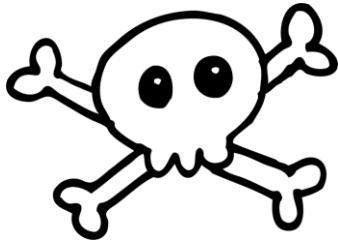

Teacher Directions Print the following pages, laminate if desired, and cut apart. If you wish to decorate a card set, print page 7 on the backs of the playing cards.

Directions Pass out all of the cards. Choose a student to begin the game. This student will also be the end of the game. Students listen as the first card is read aloud, and check their card to see if they have the answer. If they have the answer, they read their card. Play continues until it is back to the beginning card. Students must listen carefully when playing this game!
